2. Take a look at Revelation 21:1-7. What are the similarities that are found with Jeremiah 31:31-34?
  - a. Read the whole chapter (Rev. 21). How does the writing in the Book of Life connect to the writing of the law on our hearts in Jeremiah 31?
  
3. Look again at Jeremiah 31 and notice the description of the future that is promised -
  - a. What actions and activities will resume?
  
  - b. What types of people are included?
  
  - c. What words and phrases convey joy?

4. How does Jesus fulfill the promises of the new covenant mentioned in Jeremiah 31?

a. In what ways does the new covenant offer better promises than the old covenant?
