2.	Read Judges 1:19-35. Though beginning well (1:1-18), the Israelites eventually fail to drive out the Canaanites. See if your group can list all the reasons given (or hinted at) in the text for why various tribes failed to do so.		
3.	Read Judges 2:1-3. How does God assess the reasons for the Israelites' failure to drive out the Canaanites?		
	a. In verse 2, what does he say was the real purpose of the campaign?		
	b. In light of Joshua 1 and 23, why do the reasons given in verses 19-36 constitute not just military failure but spiritual unfaithfulness?		
4.	Compare Judges 2:7-10 with Deuteronomy 6:4-9, 20-23. In what ways may one generation fail to pass its faith on to the next generation?		

a. Did you have Christian parents? What was your experience?
