3.	Read v.15 What is the rationale Saul uses to justify himself. What do we learn about his motivation for disobeying the Lord from the verse?				
4.	Samuel describes Saul's sin in v.23 as akin to "divination" Read Deuteronomy 18:10 - how would you describe the severity of Saul's sin in your own words based on these texts?				
5.	In the second half of v.23 Samuel mentions "idolatry". See if you can decide how idolatry contributes to Saul's disobedience?
